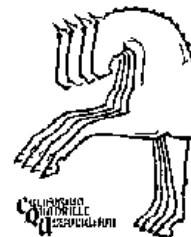

Maximum of **three** classes per horse per day through 4th Level and **two** classes per day for FEI.

Non-member, horse registration and \$15 USEF fee waived. Scores earned are not eligible for USEF or USDF.

ATTENTION COMPETITORS

Each competitor is responsible for supplying management with copies of current association numbers (USEF, USDF, CDS) for horse, owner, rider, trainer, and coach, before the day(s) of the competition.

The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers and cards may not be counted toward awards.



Dover Medal Class

USDF Dover Adult Amateur Medal is for Class #1011, Second Level Test 3

Recognizes the highest placing Adult Amateur with a custom designed pewter medal/neck ribbon and \$20 Dover Saddlery Gift Certificate.

Eligibility: USDF Group or Participating Member, USEF Amateur Member in good standing, and receive at least a 60% in the designated second level test.

Sponsored by Dover Saddlery in association with USDF.

USDF ADULT REGIONAL TEAM COMPETITION

Definition of Adult: A competitor is an adult from the beginning of the calendar year in which he or she reaches the age of 22.

The competition consists of two tests per horse/rider combination as follows:

FRIDAY: CLASSES ARE NOT COUNTED IN THE TEAM COMPETITION
Team Meeting will be held Friday afternoon, hosted by the Valley Oaks Chapter

SATURDAY: Training Level through Fourth Level: Test 1 will be used as the Team Class
FEI - Prix St. Georges, Intermediaire I, Intermediaire II, Grand Prix (including the Special)

SUNDAY: Training Level through Fourth Level: Test 2 will be used as the Team Class
FEI - Prix St. Georges, Intermediaire I, Intermediaire II, Grand Prix (including the Special)

SCORING

Training Level through Fourth Level, the percentages from Tests 1 and Tests 2 for each horse/rider will be averaged. If there are four horses, the horse/rider with the lowest combined score will be dropped.

FEI Level: One test only to count. Each horse/rider combination is allowed to enter a Saturday and a Sunday test, with the highest percentage test of each horse/rider combination to count for the Team. Winning Team will be decided by adding the highest percentage of each horse/rider combination. If there are four horses on a Team, the low score will be dropped. It is not mandatory that a horse/rider combination ride on both Saturday and Sunday.

COMPOSITION OF TEAMS

Three to four riders may be designated as a Team. On Teams of four (4) the lowest score will be dropped. Team **MUST** be named and the name **MUST** be on the entry. If you cannot agree on a name, the show will provide a name.

Training through Fourth Level: Horse/Rider combinations may participate on more than one team IF entered at two levels. For example, the horse/rider combination could be on one Team using a Training Level Test 1 and a Training Level Test 2 and on another team with a First Level Test 1 and First Level Test 2. For the purposes of this competition, FEI is treated as one level and therefore a horse/rider combination may not participate on more than one team.

Individuals who have more than one horse may enter multiple horses on one team.

Substitutions may be made prior to Saturday. If a Training through Fourth Level horse/rider are unable to compete on Sunday, no substitution may be made.

Show's Choice Teams: In addition to the entered teams, the show will take all team entries and through a draw, create additional teams. Therefore, everyone will be on the entered team and a "fantasy" team. Scores will be kept for the "fantasy" teams and separate awards will be provided by the show. This gives everyone two chances, with one effort.

CATEGORIES OF TEAMS

Non-FEI (Training Level through Fourth Level)
Mixed levels allowed, and encouraged
Teams consisting of one level will be placed into a separate category

FEI Prix St. Georges, Intermediaire I, Intermediaire II, Grand Prix (including the Special)

AWARDS

Furnished by USEF; USDF Medals with neck ribbons, High scoring INDIVIDUAL and reserve high scoring INDIVIDUAL from each division will receive Champion and Reserve Champion rosettes.

Furnished by the Show: BEST TEAM NAME and SHOW'S CHOICE TEAM

Because this is a first time effort, please understand that interpretation and application of the parameters for this competition will come into play as questions arise. One interpretation that will NOT come into play - FUN will be the main focus!!

There is no additional charge for entering the Team Competition

SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS ~ GENERAL INFORMATION

1. Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book and will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith. Scores received at the Northern Junior Championships will count toward the 2013 CDS Annual Show.
2. The Horse Show Management reserves the right to itself to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of any incident in the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Management. Their decision to be final.
3. The Horse Show Management reserves to itself the right to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries and cancel award prizes, without claim to damages; to change, cancel or combine any classes, to reschedule classes after due notice to exhibitors, or to change rings or rotate judges (USEF Article 1509.1).
4. **Competitors, trainers, agents, riders or handlers, parents or associates who cause undue furor or perceived danger to themselves or others, as determined by Show Management, will be asked to remain separated from other competitors, or should the problem be deemed unmanageable, may be asked to leave the show grounds.**
5. For the purposes of competition in the dressage division: Individuals are eligible as Juniors until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18. Individuals are eligible as Young Riders from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 16 until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 21.
6. Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to golf cars, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. **Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition, and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Rule 4.** Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.
7. **All riders while on horses are required to wear protective headgear when mounted on the competition grounds.**

ENTRY INFORMATION

8. Complete entry with check must be received by Saturday, September 10, 2012. A fax is not a complete entry. Late entries will incur a \$50 late fee and be placed on a wait list if show is full. Make checks payable to: Valley Oaks/CDS Mail entry to: Connie Davenport, 17930 Highway 20 East, Nevada City, CA 95959.
9. Refunds for cancellations made prior to stated entry closing date will be made in full, less a \$25 processing fee. After the entry closing date there will be no refunds. Refund will be mailed within thirty (30) days following the show. If a refund has not been received, you should contact the Show Management.
10. Entry blanks must be completed in every aspect. **All signatures are required.** Parents' signatures are required on a minor's entry forms. Full payment must accompany entry. Postdated checks are not acceptable (entry will not be accepted if accompanied by a postdated check). All copies of membership cards for owner and rider required. All supporting documents must accompany the entry or an internet search will be conducted at a cost of \$15.
11. Checks that do not clear the bank on the FIRST submittal will be returned. A certified check or cash totaling the amount of the entry plus a \$30 office fee will be required to clear the entry.
12. Requests to add classes to an accepted entry will also be allowed on a space available basis only, for an additional \$10 fee. All changes and scratches must be in writing.
13. Every horse entered for competition will be under the control of the Horse Show Management, but the Horse Show Management will, in no case, be responsible for any damage or loss that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold CDS, Murieta Equestrian Center, the Horse Show, its Directors and Employees, harmless for any loss or accident to his horse, horses or equipment, which may occur from sickness, theft or otherwise.
14. USEF General Rules, Chapter 6 define the protest procedure.

EXHIBITOR INFORMATION

15. Schedule will be e-mailed to exhibitors and will be on the CDS website www.california-dressage.org or Juniors web site at www.cdsjuniors.com. Times will be posted at the Horse Show Office the day before the competition begins. **DO NOT** call the Show Secretary or Show Manager for individual riding times.
16. Food and beverages will be available on the grounds.
17. Protective headgear is required as stated in DR120.5/GR01.

STABLING

18. Permanent and portable stalls are of wood or canvas construction 10' x 10'.
19. All owners, exhibitors, and parents will be held responsible for any damage incurred by them, their agents, friends or employees to stalls, building and other properties on the show grounds and shall be billed accordingly. It is strictly prohibited to dismantle or alter stalls or barn structures in any way. No nails.
20. No straw is allowed for bedding. Bedding and feed available for purchase. Bedding must be purchased on site. Stabling must be requested and paid for with entry form at \$155 (includes 2 bales of shavings). Horses staying overnight on the show grounds must be stabled. Haul-in fee is \$30 per horse per day. Stabling assignments will be made as entries are received, so please indicate any preference on your entry.
21. Horses or equipment placed in wrong stall will be moved to assigned stall and the exhibitor, owner or parent will be charged for any clean-up required. To avoid penalty charges, changes must be made through Show Management.

MISCELLANEOUS

22. All classes will be held in a standard (large) arena. Standard 20m x 60m arenas of composition footing will be used. Competition arenas may be available for warm-up purposes at scheduled times but if used any other time will result in elimination. Absolutely no one who is not entered in the competition is to use any arena until after show hours or before the first competitor entered a warm-up in the morning.
23. Competition Management shall place a minimum of two sharps containers, one in the show office and one at the end of the row of stabling. It is competition management's responsibility to replace such containers when full and dispose of them properly. Competition management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments.
24. All dogs must be on leash while on showgrounds. Owners of a loose dog will be fined \$50.
25. Current USEF, FEI Tests, USDF Freestyle, and Quadrille Tests will be used.
26. Non-competing horse fee is \$50. Each non-competing horse must have a signed release, wear an assigned number, must observe the rules governing the use of the warm-up areas and must pay any required fees, including stabling, haul-in and grounds fees. Any horse brought onto the grounds, including the parking lots, is subject to the rules of the show and to the legal and financial requirements of the show. This includes horses that never leave a horse trailer. Violations of this rule will result in double the fees due. Only horses entered in the show and wearing official competition numbers will be allowed in the official warm-up arenas. Horses must wear their number when out of the stall. All non-competing horses must wear a number anytime they are out of their stalls and ride in arena assigned to them.
27. No lunging of horses in the warm-up ring while the show is in progress; please check with Show Management or Technical Delegate or Ring Steward as to location of lunging area.
28. In the event of rain prior to the show, it is the rider's responsibility to call Show Management to determine whether the show is cancelled. Shows are NOT cancelled unless the footing is deemed unsafe.
29. No one on foot will be allowed in the warm-up arenas. Coaches, trainers, parents, grooms and friends must stay outside the arena.
30. MUSIC CASSETTES/CDs—it is the rider's responsibility to see that his music is at the announcer's booth when they are ready to enter the arena. The person with the tape/CD will be responsible for making sure the music is cued and will give the announcer the signal as to when to start the music. Check with the Show Office for the time set aside for a sound check. Be sure to pick up tapes and CDs.

USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$30 non-member registration fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk-trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF Introductory Level test, Pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions; 8) Opportunity classes; 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of a current membership in good standing of their own National Federation; 10) USEA beginner novice divisions; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sports Horse Breeding classes.

Protective Headgear Rules for Dressage (rev. 2.28.11)

Effective March 1, 2011, the following rules apply to Dressage Competitions, and *Regular Competitions holding “open” Dressage classes (i.e., Dressage classes that are open to all breeds):

1. Riders under age 18 must wear protective headgear, as defined by DR120.5 and in compliance with GR801, at all times while mounted on the competition grounds. This includes non-competing riders as well as those competing at any level.
2. While on horses competing in national level tests (Fourth Level and below), riders must wear protective headgear as defined by DR120.5 and in compliance with GR801, at all times while mounted on the competition grounds. This includes non-competing riders on horses competing in national level tests.
3. While on horses competing in USEF or FEI Young Horse Tests, and FEI Junior Tests, riders must wear protective headgear as defined by DR120.5 and in compliance with GR801, at all times while mounted on the competition grounds.
4. All riders competing in Para-Equestrian tests must wear protective headgear at all times while mounted on the competition grounds. Riders who compete in PE tests must wear protective headgear on every horse they ride, no matter the level or test.
5. All riders of any age while on non-competing horses must wear protective headgear at all times while mounted on the competition grounds.
6. All riders under age 18 and all riders while on horses competing in national level tests, who choose to wear Armed Services or police uniform, must wear protective headgear as defined in DR120.5 and in compliance with GR801 at all times while mounted on the competition grounds. Riders age 18 and over who wear Armed Services or police uniform on horses that are competing *only* in FEI levels and tests at the Prix St. Georges level and above must wear either protective headgear or the appropriate military/police cap or hat for their branch of service.
7. When a horse is competing in both national and FEI levels or tests (e.g. Fourth Level and PSG), the rider must wear protective headgear at all times when mounted on that horse on the competition grounds and during all tests.
8. While on horses that are competing *only* in FEI levels and tests at the Prix St. Georges level and above (including FEI Young Rider Tests, the USEF Developing Prix St. Georges Test and the USEF Brentina Cup Test), riders *age 18 and over* are not required to wear protective headgear in warm up or during competition. However, these riders may wear protective headgear without penalty from the judge.
9. In FEI-recognized (CDI, CDI-Y, CDI-J, CDI-P, etc.) classes, FEI rules take precedence and protective headgear is permitted but not required.
10. All riders while on horses competing in national level classes such as Equitation, Materiale and DSHB Under Saddle are required to wear protective headgear at all times when mounted on the competition grounds.

*11. When a “Regular Competition” offers “open” Dressage classes, section or division, cross entry is not permitted by any **horse/rider combination** between Dressage and other “breed” (e.g., Arabian, Morgan, Friesian, Andalusian/Lusitano) classes held on the same day(s) at the competition. However, a rider competing in “open” dressage classes may ride a different horse in breed classes at the same competition, in which case he/she must wear protective headgear only when riding the horse(s) entered in dressage classes. The rider would not be required to wear protective headgear while schooling or in competition on the horse(s) entered in the breed classes. When a “Regular Competition” offers a “breed restricted” Dressage section or division, DR120 applies only to the designated Dressage warm-up and competition areas, or when the exhibitor is actually warming-up for a Dressage class, and the same horse/rider combination may compete in other breed classes. Horses entered in a Dressage Competition may never be ridden in another Licensed competition on the same day.

Protective headgear is defined as a riding helmet which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. The headgear and harness must be secured and properly fitted. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place.

Recommendation to competitions:

In order to distinguish riders who are required to wear protective headgear from those who aren't, it is suggested that entry numbers in a different sequence be assigned to the entries in each group (e.g. use numbers from 1-700 for entries where riders must wear protective headgear and use numbers from 800 and above for entries where riders are not required to use protective headgear).

CALIFORNIA DRESSAGE SOCIETY - STATEMENT ON ANIMAL WELFARE

The California Dressage Society, an organization of approximately 5,000 individual members, supports the concept of humane and ethical treatment of all animals.

Dressage is a classical method of the training of horses in which the horse's natural responses and athletic abilities become a capable responsive partnership with the rider.

To this end the California Dressage Society is committed to ensuring that owners, trainers, exhibitors and their agents use responsible care in the training, handling, transportation and exhibition of horses.

The California Dressage Society supports scientific research on equine health and stress.

The California Dressage Society is committed to the continuous review, revision and development of competition rules and regulations to protect the welfare of horses.

The California Dressage Society firmly believes that horses are a vital part of its members' life experience and as such deserve our protection and compassion. Humans have an inseparable relationship with the natural world and animals. Furthermore, humanity is accountable to a set of laws and concepts that is uniquely a product of human society. Animals cannot be subject to those laws and concepts and therefore do not have the rights of humans.

Humans are responsible for providing adequate food, water and shelter for horses. CDS supports management and training practices which promote health, prevent disease and protect horses from unnecessary pain and injury.

CDS believes that Dressage Competition is the ultimate test of training to determine the development of harmony between horse and rider. All sanctioned CDS competitions and events will be conducted under the organization's rules regarding the well-being and welfare of horses.

USDF Statement on Animal Welfare

The United States Dressage Federation, Inc. (USDF), a federation of over 125 independent organizations throughout the United States with a membership in excess of 33,000 members, supports the concept of ethical treatment of animals.

Dressage is a classical method of training horses, based upon the horse's natural responses, as carried out in a gradual, planned program during which the horse's athletic abilities are improved in a systematic manner. As a result, the horse becomes capable, comfortable, and responsive in partnership with the rider without the use of force. Dressage competition at various levels of achievement is the ultimate test of the training program to determine whether the desired harmony between horse and rider has been achieved.

The rules pertaining to dressage competition prohibit the use of artificial appliances, training aids, and drugs, which would force the horse to submit. Instead, the emphasis is upon training and a cooperative partnership with the rider. Major competitions are carefully monitored to assure that there is no unnecessary force or harshness displayed.

Unlike other horse sports in which horses enter training at a relatively immature state, dressage training is usually not seriously begun until the horse is three or four. The top levels of achievement require five or more years of progressive training and it is not unusual to see horses in international competition in their late teens. This, in itself, places a premium on good care and soundness throughout the horse's life.

While supporting the concept of animal welfare in its broadest form, the United States Dressage Federation, Inc., also recognizes that it is unrealistic to ascribe human emotions and responses to the horse which in its wild state is a creature of flight, living a hard and precarious existence. Under domestication, the horse is assured of ample food, water, and shelter, as well as protection against infectious diseases and damaging parasites, thus leading a longer and healthier life with a high rate of survival.

As an educational organization, USDF has numerous programs, which teach people how to pursue the accepted, humane training methods. A program of certifying instructors also emphasizes protecting the horse's welfare in pursuit of dressage training.

Divisions

Individuals are eligible as **Juniors** until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18.

Individuals are eligible as **Young Riders** from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 16 until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 21.

Competitors shall compete as Adults from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 22. Individuals possessing current amateur certification are only eligible as **Adult Amateurs** from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach age 22.

Q=Great American Insurance Group/USDF Qualifying Classes: Entries must supply copy of membership cards for Owner, Rider, and Horses for USDF and USEF. Trainer must supply a copy of USEF membership.

Opportunity Classes: Opportunity Classes will be held in accordance with USEF GR331. Scores from these classes will not be included for any high point or year-end awards. Horses entered only in these classes are exempt from USDF fees and the Federation fee (USEF), including the Equine Drugs and Medication fee but they are still subject to and must comply with the Drugs and Medication rules and may be selected for drug testing. Horses entered only in these classes are not required to have a Horse Identification (HID) or Recording Number but are to list the numbers if the horse has been assigned a Horse Identification (HID) or recording Number. Riders only entering these classes are exempt from the USDF and Federation membership requirements and are not required to pay a non-member fee but are required to list the Federation membership number if the participant is a member. Riders and horses may also enter Introductory classes with the same exemptions other than the drug testing fee (\$15). Cross entry to other classes is allowed but then all applicable fees and membership requirements apply.

2012 USDF/Dover Saddlery Adult Amateur Medal Program

The USDF/Dover Saddlery Adult Amateur Medal Program is designed to specifically recognize and encourage adult amateurs riding at Second Level.

Awards

1. **USDF Dover Saddlery Medal Recipient**
The eligible rider with the highest score of 60 percent or better in the designated Second Level Test Three class or applicable test of choice USDF/Dover Saddlery Adult Amateur Medal class at a participating competition will receive a handcrafted USDF/Dover Saddlery pewter medal and neck ribbon. Winners will receive a \$20 Dover Saddlery gift certificate for the first three USDF/Dover Saddlery Medals they win during the competition season.
2. **USDF/Dover Saddlery National Merit Award**
A USDF/Dover Saddlery National Merit Award will be awarded to riders winning three USDF/Dover Saddlery Medals in the same competition year.
3. **Year-End Awards**
The USDF/Dover Saddlery Medal National Champion and Reserve Champion are determined from the average of the top three winning ride scores during the competition year. The champion receives a \$1000 Dover Saddlery gift certificate and the reserve champion receives a \$500 Dover Saddlery gift certificate.

Rider Eligibility

To be eligible, a rider must meet the following criteria:

1. Rider must be a current USDF Participating Member or Group Member at the time of the competition.
2. Rider must be an adult amateur in accordance with Article GR1306 of the USEF rules and be designated with USEF as a adult amateur as of the completion date.

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership, Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF NM fee. (Note: USDF business members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF BM.) Individuals cannot compete at a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition with a USDF Education Membership.

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, Pas de Deux, Quadrille, FEI ParaEquestrian classes, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot, academy and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$75), 5-years (\$300), or life (\$1,500). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$60). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Finals and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$200) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Education Membership (EM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. This online education only membership expires 12 months after the date joined. This membership type does NOT allow an individual to compete at a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$25 and a USDF NM form per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF member there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$25). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded, but will NOT be counted towards Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes or Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Finals. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$70. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$95) is eligible for Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Finals and Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.
